### What have we been doing in Nursery this week?

This week we have been talking about Harvest. We read the story of **The Little Red Hen** who baked some bread using a grain of wheat. We retold the story together using pictures and learnt how important it is to work as a team. For snack this week we had a lovely freshly baked loaf. We also made dough using flour, salt and water, it was very messy but it helped us to develop our language skills when talking about the texture.

In maths this week we have been looking at the **number 1**. We learnt about a ten frame and what number one looks like inside it. We have met our first Ten Town character, King One from our maths program Ten Town. We looked at quantities of 1 and learnt a rhyme to help us write number one. *"From top to toe and there you go"*.
