What have we been doing in Nursery this week?

This week we have been learning about growing. We read a story called The Tiny Seed by Eric Carle, about the journey of a seed and how it grows into a big and beautiful flower. We have planted our own seeds and made predictions about what colours the flowers might be when they grow. We talked about how plants need sun and water to grow and sang a song called "Hello Mr Sun" to help us remember. We are going to work hard to grow and look after our plants.

In Maths this week, we have been recapping the names and properties of 2D shapes. We played our shape monster game and matched the correct shapes by looking at the number of sides and corners that they have. We have also been practising subitising (saying the number without counting) in Nursery this week using a range of things in our environment.
