Topic Work

In Jigsaw this week have been talking about what makes a good friend and what we would like our friends to be like. We read a Bible story from the New Testament about Jesus and His disciples. We talked about the special friendship Jesus had with His disciples.

On Friday we celebrated Green Day and talked about ways we can look after our planet. We read Michael Recycle by Ellie Bethel and talked about why it is important to recycle things and how it can be fun.

What have we been doing in Nursery this week?

This week, we have been reading the story The Enormous Watermelon by Brenda Parkes and Judith Smith. We used repetitive story language to retell the story using our own enormous watermelon. It was very heavy! We talked about different words we could use for the word big. Some words we liked were huge, massive and enormous. We used our senses to look at, touch, smell and taste some juicy watermelon. We spotted lots of characters in the book that we know from our favourite nursery rhymes.

In Maths this week, we recapped **number 4**. We listened to the story and song for Ten Town character, Freddie Four. We learnt a rhyme to help us write number 4. "Down, across, oar in the water". We named 2D shapes, squares and rectangles, and counted how many sides and corners they have. We looked at the similarities and differences between a square a rectangle.
