


WORLD BOOK DAY

CASHLESS SYSTEM

We will shortly be introducing a cashless payment system allowing parents to go on line to pay for school meals, trips etc. Further information to follow.

ATTENDANCE NEWS: INTRODUCTING HOME VISITS

Thank you to all our parents and carers who endeavour, where possible, to have their children in school every day and on time. We are continually looking for ways to improve attendance and punctuality and support families and their children who are regularly absent or late.

Our statutory safeguarding duty means that we must be aware of the reason for any pupil absence. Therefore, if we are not notified of a reason for a pupil absence and if we are unable to make any contact with the parent/carer, members of the Senior Leadership and Welfare Team will conduct a home visit during the morning in accordance with school and Local Authority attendance expectations and safeguarding procedures.

Home visits will commence on Friday 1st February. Please note that we will continue to try to make contact with you by phone and also send you a text message explaining that we intend to make a home visit.

BIRTHDAY TREATS

We all know how excited children are about their birthdays and how much they want to share their celebrations with classmates.

However, in these days of healthy messages and food allergies could I please request that you keep the class treat simple, bearing in mind that not all children are able to celebrate this way. A small fairy cake would be sufficient if you choose to send a treat for classmates. Please check the Food and Nutrition Policy for further details (available on our website).

SCHOOL PROCEDURE IN EVENT OF BAD WEATHER (SNOW)

Every attempt will be made to open the school as normal during adverse weather conditions. Where it is impossible to ensure the Health and Safety of the children, a decision will be made by myself and the Governors to close the school until conditions improve.

In such a case you are advised to:

- Check SMA website and Parent App.
- Check your mobile phone for "school closure" text messages.
- Listen to local radio stations or check their websites for school updates. They are invaluable sources of information on such occasions.

PROCEDURES FOR DETERIORATING WEATHER THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL DAY

Should the weather deteriorate as the day progresses and you are concerned about picking up your child(ren), please contact the school. Please note that **SCHOOL DOES NOT CLOSE EARLY WITHOUT NOTICE.** It remains open until the last child safely leaves the building.

E-SAFETY

We are sure that many children received electronic gizmos and gadgets from Father Christmas. As most of these devices can connect to the internet, it's never too early to reinforce the importance of staying safe on-line. Most devices have different safety features designed to protect children and ensure they can browse the web as safely as possible.

SMA E-Safety and Acceptable Use Policy states that we encourage parents/carers to:

- Discuss e-safety issues with their children, supporting the school in its e-safety policy and reinforcing appropriate behaviour at home and in school.
- Not allow their child to lie about their age and access social networking sites e.g. Facebook.
- Dissuade pupils from posting or uploading photographs /videos online.

SAFER INTERNET DAY

Each year we carry out work for Safer Internet Day. This year Safer Internet Day is on the 5th February and the key message is 'Together for a Better Internet'.

DOGS ON SITE

Please be reminded that dogs are **NOT ALLOWED** on site as per City Council guidelines, this includes dogs being carried.

PE KITS

Please ensure that your child has his/her PE kit in school at all times, thank you.
