# **INFORMATION**

# **MOBILE PHONES**

We recognise that mobile phones are part of everyday life for many children and that they can play an important role in helping pupils to feel safe and secure. However we also recognise that they can prove a distraction in school and can provide a means of bullying or intimidating others. Therefore:

- Pupils are NOT permitted to have mobile phones at school or on school trips.
- If in the rare event of a parent wishing for his/her child to bring a mobile phone to school to contact the parent after school:
- The phone must be switched off and handed in to the school office and collected at home time. Please note the phone is left at the owners own risk. SMA cannot be held responsible for loss/damage.
- Mobile phones brought to school without permission/used inappropriately will be **confiscated** and will only be returned to parents/carers at the end of the day or at a mutually convenient time. The phone **will not** be returned to the pupil until a meeting has occurred with the parent/carer.

## **SUN SAFETY**

The sun is finally shining and you can help protect your child from the dangers of the sun's rays in the following ways:

- Actively encourage your child to wear a hat when they are outside during the school day. A wide brimmed hat is ideal. Please ensure that the hat has your child's name and class written inside.
- Apply a good layer of high factor sun cream before coming to school.
- If you wish your child to apply sun cream during the day, the bottle or tube must be labelled with your child's name and class. Please note that children will need to apply the sun cream themselves. We are not permitted to apply sun cream to children as they may be allergic to some brands.
- Talk to your child about being safe in the sun.
- Encourage your child to bring a (cheap!) pair of sunglasses in to school to be worn outdoors.
- Water will be provided to all children throughout the day as and when required.

#### **COOKERY CLUB**

Mrs Burrows runs cookery clubs for our pupils throughout the year. This term, we have been very fortunate to receive a funding grant organised by Cllr Steve Radford and funded by Tuebrook Hope Group Charity and West Derby Wastelands Charity. We will be running cookery classes for children and parents over the coming weeks. More details regarding the first year group to be invited will be provided after half term.

#### **BREAKFAST CLUB**

Breakfast Club opens at 8:00am each day. We open the doors a few minutes early on those occasions when the weather is very poor.
