BIRTHDAY TREATS

DINNER MONEY

School meals are available at a cost of £1.90 per day, (£9.50 per week). Since non-payment for school meals affects the quality of service we offer the children, we need to ensure that all payments are up to date.

Governors have adopted the Liverpool City Council Policy with regard to dinner money debt. Letters will be sent out accordingly if parents fail to pay in a timely manner. You may be asked to provide a packed lunch for your child until the debt is cleared. Dinner money should be sent to school every Monday, in the green envelopes provided, and passed in to the school office. Thank you. From 1st September 2013, the Department for Education changed the regulations regarding requests for family holidays during term time.

This means there is NO legal entitlement for parents to take their children on holiday during term-time. The new regulations also make it clear that Headteachers may not authorise the leave during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

All exceptional requests for Leave of Absence in term time must be made on the form obtained from the office.

Unauthorised forms will be submitted to the LA for consultation and a Penalty Fine may be issued.

BIKES

Many children bring their bikes to school which is a super healthy mode of transport. Please ensure that bikes are locked up securely in our bike shed. SMA cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.

If parents/carers choose to travel to school on their bikes also, we would respectfully ask them to dismount their bike once on site for the safety of our children, parents and staff.

A reminder that apart from guide dogs, dogs (even those being carried/transported in another way) are not allowed on city council premises. Thank you for your co-operation.

Please note the deadline for Year 6 to Year 7 is 31st October. Please be aware that some Secondary Schools are already holding open evenings and their closing dates are sometimes earlier than LCC closing date of 31st October.
