

Unit 5.5: Old Testament Women

Christian Values:

Wisdom - Justice - Perseverance

Key Vocabulary:

Ruth: A woman from the Old Testament who was a loyal friend to her mother in law Naomi by not leaving her alone and continuing to support her rather than going back to her own family after the death of her son, Ruth's husband.

Esther: Stands as one of the great figures of courage and faith in the Old Testament. Her people, the Israelites, were living in Babylon and had people plotting against the Jews hoping to kill them. Queen Esther approached the king and was able to save her people.

Jochebed: The daughter of Levi, the wife of Amram and the mother of Aaron, Miriam and Moses.

Purim: The Jewish holiday in which Jews commemorate being saved from persecution in the ancient Persian Empire.

Key Questions:

- What can I learn from this story?
- Why is this a significant moment? Why is this woman important?
- In which values and beliefs are the actions of the women rooted?
