

Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter - Term IA.

<u>Reading:</u> We will take part in daily Phonics sessions where we will learn to recognise and read a range of sounds and words. We will also build our accuracy, fluency and storytelling voice by reading decodable books. In addition, we will have the opportunity to read and enjoy a range of texts in our reading area/classroom

Writing: In English this term, we will be studying the text, 'A River' by Marc Martin. From this vehicle text we will be following the cycle of immerse - analyse - plan - write and edit. We will be writing a circular narrative for our fiction writing and letter for our non-fiction report.

Spelling: As part of our spelling lessons this half term, we will be working on the following:

Unit 1: the 'or' sound spelt ${\bf a}$ before ${\bf l}$ and ${\bf l}{\bf l}$

Unit 2: the soft 'c' sound

Mathematics:

In Maths this term we will be focusing on the following topics: number: place value.

Science:

Our Science topic this half term is Materials. As part of this topic, children will be taught to:

- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses
- Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

Religious Education:

Our Religious Education topic this half term is The Bible: Why is the Bible such a special book. The aims of this topic are to wider the children's understanding of the Bible, its contents, presentation and importance to Christians and begin to develop children's understanding of holy books from faiths other than Christianity and their significance in the lives of believers and the Christian Values we will be exploring are faith, reverence, respect and wisdom. The key questions we will be answering through this topic are: Why is the Bible special? Why does the vican/minister think that the Bible is special? Which Bible stories do you enjoy and why? Who uses the Bible and why? and Why and how are the two parts of the Bible different?

History:

Our History topic this half term is 'Who made the greatest contribution to nursing?' During this topic we will look at the contributions made by Edith Cavell, Kitty Wilkinson, Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale.
